Santa Clara residents benefit from City services that add to their quality of life

Santa Clara is a “full service” city – one of only a few communities in the Bay Area that has its own police, fire, library, recreation, and electric, water, and sewer utilities, as well as all of the other departments and civic amenities expected in a thriving community.

Being a resident of a full service city offers many advantages including convenience, a City-wide commitment to excellence and outstanding customer service, and reduced costs of service. For example, customers of Santa Clara’s utilities pay the lowest rates in the nine Bay Area counties.



If there is a downside to having such a broad array of services under one municipal umbrella, it’s that residents may not be aware of all the City of Santa Clara has to offer. With so many services — designed for all age groups, interests and needs – it can be difficult to keep track of what’s available.

We hope this overview summary of City services will help the residents of Santa Clara become more familiar with City services and encourage residents to explore and take advantage of living in a full service community.

2-1-1

The City of Santa Clara supports the 2-1-1 service of United Way Silicon Valley that provides residents with free, confidential information 24 hours a day, 7 days a week in 170 languages. This is a non-emergency phone number that helps to provide access to health and human services for everyday needs and in times of crisis. It can also be found online at 211scc.org.

5-1-1

Santa Clara participates with other Bay Area communities in the free 5-1-1 phone and web service that provides residents with up-to-the-minute information on traffic conditions, schedules and fares for public transportation services, referrals to carpools and vanpools and more. The website is 511.org.

9-1-1

Calm, efficient and highly trained City dispatchers are on the job for Santa Clara residents 24 hours a day, every day of the year, ready to send emergency help – police, fire, paramedics — when needed.

Abandoned Shopping Carts

Residents who would like to have abandoned shopping carts removed from their neighborhoods are encouraged to contact the store that owns the cart. A list of contact numbers is available on the City website, santaclaraca.gov/abandonedshoppingcarts. If a cart is unmarked or the store is unresponsive, residents can call the Street Department at (408) 615-3080 for action.

Abandoned Vehicles

Residents can report vehicles that have been parked in one location on a City street for more than 72 hours on the Abandoned Vehicle Abatement Hotline, 408-615-4778, and the City will begin the notification process to have it removed.

Affordable Housing

The City of Santa Clara offers affordable priced homes to purchase for moderate-income households. For detailed information on below market priced homes, call the City’s Housing & Community Services Division at 408-615-2490.

Animal Services

Silicon Valley Animal Control Services (SVACA) provides the residents of Santa Clara with a full range of animal services including low cost vaccination and microchip clinics, adoption programs, classes on animal care and training, the care of injured, lost and abandoned animals, and more. It is located at 3370 Thomas Rd. For information, visit svaca.com or call 408-764-0344.

Appliance Disposal

Santa Clara residents can dispose of old refrigerators and other large appliances at no cost during the annual community Clean-Up Campaign each spring. Residential customers of Silicon Valley Power, the City’s electric utility, can also receive a rebate for removing an old working refrigerator. See “Rebates” for more details.

Automatic Utility Payment

Utility customers may charge their utility bill payments [electric/Silicon Valley Power, water, sewer, refuse collection] automatically to a credit card on the last day of the utility’s grace period. For more information, visit “My Utilities Account” at santaclaraca.gov or call 408-615-2300.

Bicycles

The City of Santa Clara contains 23.6 miles of bike lanes, 5.8 miles of bike routes and 9.3 miles of recreational paths – and publishes a bicycle map to show their locations. See it on the City website or call the Engineering Department at 408-615-3000.

Burglary Prevention

Residents can mark their valuables with their California driver’s license number by borrowing engraving equipment from the Santa Clara Central Park Library.

Candidates Forums

The City hosts municipal Candidate Forums during election years so that residents can become acquainted with the individuals running for public office in Santa Clara. Events are broadcast live on Cable Channel 15. Elections are held in even numbered years: 2016, 2018, 2020, etc.

Cell Phone Recycling

Donate your old cell phone to the Santa Clara Senior Center for emergency use by senior citizens and disabled persons. For information, call 408-615-3170.

Children & Youth

The City of Santa Clara provides many services for our younger residents – from library story times for infants through an active Teen Center and the opportunity to grow leadership skills as a member of the Youth Commission. Both the Library and the Parks & Recreation Department offer dozens of programs every month designed for children and teens. Full schedules of activities and facilities can be found on the City website at santaclaraca.gov.

Christmas Tree Recycling

Christmas trees are picked up at no cost the first full week in January as part of the regular weekly collection of garbage, Clean Green and recycling and chipped into mulch. Residents of apartments and multi-family units may place their trees curbside on the regular solid waste pickup day for their neighborhood. For information, call 408-615-3080.

Citizens Police Academy

Residents over the age of 21 who would like to learn more about community policing can enroll in a 12-session program that presents an overview of police functions and operations. Participants in the Citizens Police Academy also ride along with an on-duty officer, tour the County jail and participate in various role playing exercises. Citizenship Practice Tests

Residents who are applying for U.S. citizenship can take two different practice exams at no cost on the library's website. Go to library.santaclaraca.gov and click on Research and then on Learning Express Library. The library also has many books and videos about becoming a U.S. citizen. City-wide Garage Sale

Code Enforcement

City staff follows up on every code compliance complaint made by residents who believe that one or more of the hundreds of City codes designed to maintain a healthy, safe and clean environment has been violated. Code Enforcement information detailing the most common situations is posted on the City website, santaclaraca.gov. For information, call 408-615-2210.

Community Emergency Response Teams (CERT)

Residents can sign up for a 20-hour training program to learn how to take care of themselves, their families and their neighborhoods in the event of a disaster. Participants learn fire suppression, basic medical care, light search and rescue and other safety skills. Graduates receive a manual, safety helmet and reflective vest. Community Involvement

The City of Santa Clara offers residents a variety of opportunities to become involved with their community and government, including serving on a City Commission, Board or Committee.

Openings are posted in the City Clerk's Office at City Hall and on the City website, santaclaraca.gov/commissions. Residents are invited to volunteer their time and expertise in the Citizens Police Academy, Fire Reserves, CERT program, Leadership Santa Clara, Police Activities League, and at the library, parks, Senior Center and recreation activities. Crime Prevention

The Santa Clara Police Department offers residents a wide variety of tips and resources they can use every day to stay safe. They are posted online at scpd.org/crime/tips_resources.html. The guidelines help residents learn how to protect themselves in a variety of situations at home, at work, while shopping, or walking and driving on the street.

Curbside Recycling

A large variety of items can conveniently be recycled curbside. Common household items including glass containers, aluminum and metal cans, scrap metal, plastic containers, newspapers, mixed paper and cardboard may be placed into your blue, wheeled cart for weekly pick-up. Used motor oil (placed in a one gallon container with a secure fitted lid) and used oil filters (placed in a leak-proof bag) will be collected when placed next to the blue, wheeled cart. For information about recycling, call 408-615-3080. Yard clippings are also collected weekly on the curb in a separate Clean Green container. Residents may request extra Clean Green containers for one-time cleanups or during the leaf

Dog Park

Dogs can enjoy an off leash romp at the City's Dog Park, 888 Reed St. which has a separate area for small dogs, benches and picnic tables, water for pets and humans and off street parking.

Domestic Violence

The City of Santa Clara contracts with the Support Network for Battered Women to provide counseling, legal services, and emergency shelter to residents and their children who are victims of domestic violence. For details, call 408-541-6100. Emergency domestic violence incidents should be reported by calling the Santa Clara Police Department at 9-1-1.

Drug Abuse Prevention

The Santa Clara Police Department teaches every 5th grader in 17 public and private schools in Santa Clara about the consequences of drug abuse, and provides them with skills to resist peer pressure to experiment with drugs, alcohol and tobacco.

E-billing

City utility customers can automatically receive and pay their bills online. To sign up, visit myaccount.santaclaraca.com and click on Bill Payment Options.

Emergency Preparedness

Helpful information on how to be better prepared for disasters such as earthquakes is available in the Emergency Preparedness Guidelines published by the City. It can be accessed on the City website or printed copies picked up at City Hall, the Santa Clara City Library, or City Fire Stations. The Guidelines include checklists for supplies you should have at home, at work, and in the car in order to be self-sufficient for 72 hours. It also includes pointers on what to do during and after an earthquake, and how you and your family can help prevent a pandemic flu.

Emergency Shelters

In case of a natural or man-made disaster that requires residents to leave their homes, the City of Santa Clara will provide emergency shelter at such locations as the Senior Center and the Community Recreation Center. Public notice about the opening of emergency shelters will be broadcast on Cable Channel 15, on commercial radio and TV news programs, and on the City website.

Employment

The City of Santa Clara offers excellent employment opportunities ranging from administrative to technical positions, career-track police officers to part-time crossing guards. For a complete list of openings, visit santaclaraca.gov or call 408-615-JOBS. Jobs available are also sent through Twitter alerts. Sign up by visiting twitter.com/SantaClaraCity, and select the "Follow" button underneath the City Seal.

Jobseekers can also get useful information on local companies, new careers and job search skills at the Santa Clara City Library through its Job Hunting in Santa Clara resource tool. Ask about it at the Reference or Information Desks at the library, or explore it online at library.santaclaraca.gov.

Energy Use Tracking Tools

Want to save energy, but don't know how to track your usage? The City has tools to help you find out how much it costs to run your refrigerator, identify GFI circuits, reduce drafts and more. Residential customers of Silicon Valley Power, the City's electric utility, can borrow tracking items from the Tool Lending Library. eNotify

Get up to the minute City news and event information in your email box. You can specify which types of events and news information you would like to receive. Sign up on the City website santaclaraca.gov/enotify.

Fire Safety

Santa Clara's Fire Department responds to approximately 9,000 calls for service from residents and visitors each year, and is proud that its highly trained staff is able to respond within three minutes after notification. Fire safety tips are published in *Inside Santa Clara*, the City's quarterly newspaper and posted on the City website santaclaraca.gov so that residents can take steps to protect themselves, their families and their property.

Fireworks

The City of Santa Clara is one of the few remaining communities in the Bay Area to offer a free fireworks display on July 4th. The spectacular display is the closing entertainment of the All-City Picnic in Central Park, and is partially supported by the donations of individuals and businesses.

Flood Insurance

Because of the City of Santa Clara's high rating in the National Flood Insurance Program, property owners in Santa Clara can receive a 10% discount in the premium costs for NFIP policies issued or renewed in the Special Flood Hazard Area. Current flood maps and flood protection references are available at Santa Clara Central Park Library and the City's Permit Center.

Flooding

If the storm drain catch basin on your street becomes clogged, call the Santa Clara Street Department at 408-615-3080 to have it cleared so that flooding will not occur during heavy rainfalls. If flooding is likely to occur, City staff will visit each neighborhood that is threatened to distribute advisory notices.



Free Events

Spring: Easter Egg Hunt at Central Park for children ages 3-8. You bring the basket, the City provides free brightly colored eggs and candy to find, and everyone enjoys family entertainment.

Summer: Pro and backyard barbecue teams compete at the Silicon Valley BBQ Championships in Central Park, with live music and family-friendly fun. Free entertainment and activities for children, with fireworks at night are offered at the All City Picnic in Central Park on Independence Day. There are Wednesday and

Sunday Concerts in the Park at Central Park Pavilion and a Street Dance at Franklin Square.

Fall: The Annual Art & Wine Festival is two days of free entertainment and fun in Central Park each September. Community groups cook up international foods for purchase to accompany wine tasting and art exhibits. All proceeds of the festival benefit local charities.

Winter: The Holiday Tree Lighting Ceremony on the first Friday evening in December features entertainment and refreshments and is the traditional opening of the holiday season in Santa Clara. The tree is located at the Civic Center and is topped by Teddy, a stuffed bear that has looked over Santa Clara's holiday festivities since 1911.

Garbage

In addition to regular collection of garbage, residents of Santa Clara are offered the opportunity each year to clean out their homes and yards, and get rid of unwanted materials in the annual community Clean-Up Campaign scheduled in the spring. Residents may dispose of bulky items and discards not normally taken by their regular weekly solid waste collection. Rules, regulations and pick-up dates for your neighborhood can be found in the Annual Report/City Calendar and the spring issue of *Inside Santa Clara*, the City newspaper. There are also two free disposal days for Santa Clara residents each year where, with proof of residency, you can dispose of up to 7 cubic yards of waste (including up to 1 cubic yard of concrete, asphalt or dirt) at no cost. Materials must be brought to the Mission Trail Waste Systems Materials Recovery Facility. Appointments are required. Call 408-727-5365.

Garbage Overflow

Throughout the year, residents who have more garbage than can be contained in their garbage cart can purchase "extra bag" tags for a \$4.00 fee for each additional 32-gallon bag of garbage. During the two-week period following

Christmas, residents may set out as many as four additional 32-gallon plastic garbage bags (limit of two per week), at no extra charge. For more information, call 408-615-3080.

Genealogy Research

You can learn more about your ancestors and create a family tree with resources at the Central Park Library Heritage Pavilion, which has an excellent local history collection and one of the finest genealogical libraries in the Bay Area, and is home base of the Santa Clara County Historical & Genealogical Society.

Gifts

At the City Store, residents can show their community pride by buying merchandise featuring the City Seal. The City Store is located at the Santa Clara Chamber of Commerce, 1850 Warburton Ave.



Special privileges for residents at Santa Clara Golf Course

Golf

Santa Clara residents pay a reduced green fee and receive early tee-time reservation privileges to play the championship 18-hole golf course at the Santa Clara Golf & Tennis Club, 5155 Stars and Stripes Dr. There is also a lighted golf range, practice putting green, locker room and showers, and David's Restaurant, which features a snack shop, bar, restaurant and banquet facilities. Graffiti Removal

Call the Street Department at 408-615-3080 to report graffiti, and the Police Department's Dial-a-Tip/Graffiti Hotline at 408-241-9495 to report suspect information. Always dial 9-1-1 if graffiti, vandalism or other crimes are in progress. Information that leads to the apprehension of a person who defaces a building or property in Santa Clara may qualify for a \$250 reward. For information, visit santaclaraca.gov/graffiti.

Great America Theme Park

Because California's Great America Theme Park is located on land leased from the City of Santa Clara, residents are sometimes offered discounts and other special benefits. Check with the Santa Clara Chamber for events and potential ticket availability, at 408-244-8244.

Health & Wellness

Residents over the age of 50 have access to free services through the Health & Wellness program at the Senior Center designed to maintain a healthy, independent life including: education, support groups, flu shot clinics, blood pressure and glucose testing, safety checks, resource referrals and strategies to help seniors live independently longer. Home visits are available for those with limited mobility. To schedule an appointment, call 408-615-3170. The Santa Clara City Library also frequently schedules speakers on health topics. The Kaiser Health and Wellness Collection contains many materials related to health, fitness, chronic disease management, and general wellness topics.



Historic Photos

Prints of historic photographs of Santa Clara can be ordered by residents at cost. About 150 of the photographs are on display in the corridors of City Hall. To view the entire collection, visit the Headen-Inman House, 1509 Warburton Ave., on Sundays between 1-4 p.m., or call 408-248-2789 to make an appointment.

Historic Preservation

The City of Santa Clara has been in existence for more than 150 years, and residents are proud of its heritage and traditions. An extensive collection of materials related to the history of the City and the region are available to residents in the Central Park Library's Heritage Pavilion. The City owns four historic properties that are history museums operated in conjunction with local nonprofit groups. Residents on the Historical & Landmarks Commission serve as advisors to the City Council on matters related to historical places and landmarks in Santa Clara.

Holiday Outdoor Decorations Contest

Home Energy Audit

Silicon Valley Power, the City's electric utility, provides residents with free home energy audit. A qualified Energy Specialist will come to your home to help you understand your electric usage, find ways to reduce energy consumption, improve comfort and lower energy bills. Home Fire Safety

Home Improvement Loans and Grants

Low to moderate income homeowners can apply for loans and grants from the City of Santa Clara for home improvements such as re-roofing, plumbing, heating/cooling, electrical, termite damage, foundation and weatherization. For information call 408-615-2490. Seniors may also qualify for low interest loans for attic insulation and the installation of grab bars and ramps. For information call 408-615-2490.

Home Security Surveys

The Santa Clara Police Department will visit your home to identify weaknesses in your home security and suggest possible solutions. To schedule a visit, call 408-615-4876.

Household Hazardous Waste

Free drop-off days are scheduled throughout the year so that Santa Clara residents can safely dispose of household hazardous wastes such as household cleaning supplies,

leftover paint, fertilizers, pesticides and other materials that should not go to the landfill, including e-waste. For specific dates, times, and locations, visit hhw.org or call 408-299-7300.

Housing Issues

The City of Santa Clara partners with Project Sentinel, an independent nonprofit organization, to provide residents with several programs related to fair housing, mortgage problems and tenant/landlord dispute resolution. For information, call 408-720-9888.

Income Tax Help

Seniors can receive free assistance to file income tax forms at the Senior Center. Resources to help taxpayers of any age and income are available at Santa Clara City Library.

Internet Access

Free high speed access to the Internet is available from public access computers in the Santa Clara City Library. You need a Santa Clara City Library card and there are time limits on use.

Leadership Training

The City offers residents a six-month course each year called Leadership Santa Clara to provide information and skills building to individuals who have an interest in being a future community leader. In addition to presentations about City government and regional issues, participants learn presentation techniques, team building, meeting management, ethical decision-making and other skills. The program meets once per month from January through mid June, but applications can be requested at any time by calling the City Manager's Office at 408-615-2210.

Legal Information

Residents can obtain legal assistance in several ways from resources provided by the City. Residents age 60+ can sign up for a free appointment with Senior Adult Legal Assistance by contacting the Senior Center at 408-615-3170. Those who are concerned about a legal issue related to housing including tenant/landlord disputes and fair housing issues can receive help from Project Sentinel, an independent nonprofit organization that receives funding from the City to serve its residents. For information, call 408-720-9888. The Santa Clara City Library also has many resources in its collection that can help research legal issues.

Levi's® Stadium



Library

The Santa Clara City Library has repeatedly been selected as one of the best public libraries

in the U.S. based on the depth and breadth of its collection, the variety of its programs and its customer service performance. There are three Library facilities to serve Santa Clara residents. The Central Park Library, 2635 Homestead Rd., houses most of the Library's materials and is the location of many of its programs. The Mission Library Family Reading Center, 1098 Lexington St., hosts a smaller collection and focuses on literacy programs for adults and families. Northside Branch Library, 695 Moreland Way, features a 40,000-item collection, a community room, small group study areas and a technology center. Residents can enjoy all the Library has to offer at no cost. A Library card is required to check out books, DVDs, CDs and other materials and to access online databases and other resources. You must provide two valid proofs of identity to obtain a Library card, one with a photo, but you do not need to be a resident of the City of Santa Clara or a U.S. citizen.

To get a greater appreciation for all of the services available at the Library, Santa Clara residents are invited to visit and talk with a friendly librarian, and to explore the Library's website at library.santaclaraca.gov.

Literacy Services

Free literacy instruction for English-speaking adults who want to improve their basic reading, writing and/or math skills is offered at the Mission Library and Family Reading Center through the Read Santa Clara program. Local Shopping Discounts

Medical Database of Special Needs

Residents who use life and health sustaining medical equipment powered by electricity can voluntarily register with the Santa Clara Fire Department so that they can receive service during emergency conditions such as electric blackouts. To register, call 408-615-4900.

Medical Emergencies

The City of Santa Clara has 42 firefighters trained as paramedics, 120 firefighters qualified as Emergency Medical Technicians (EMTs) and six Advanced Life Support units to respond to medical emergencies. City-owned ambulances will transport patients with life-threatening conditions to the hospital if the County’s contracted ambulance provider, American Medical Response, has yet to arrive on the scene.

Mission City Memorial Park

Mission City Memorial Park, one of the oldest cemeteries in California, is owned and operated by the City of Santa Clara. The 30-acre, tree-studded site is available to any family that is looking for a beautiful final resting place for a loved one. Final disposition options include in ground burial, mausoleum placement or in ground or niche placement of cremated remains. The City maintains permanent records of individuals placed in Mission City Memorial Park and maintenance in perpetuity. Call 408-615-3790 or email cemetery@SantaClaraCA.gov.

Neighborhood Crime Reports

Easy to read incident crime maps and automated alerts are available online for residents so they can know what is going on in their neighborhoods. Just log onto crimereports.com or raidsonline.com and enter your address to get up-to-date information. Residents can also view an online database of registered sex offenders who live in Santa Clara, according to the requirements of Megan’s Law. For information, call 408-615-4700.

Neighborhood Engagement

The City is collaborating with residents through Nextdoor, an online community for neighborhoods. Join Nextdoor to engage privately with your neighbors, and receive neighborhood directed information from the City. Visit Nextdoor.com to sign up.

Neighborhood Safety

If you and your neighbors would like to become better acquainted, prepare for an emergency and help prevent crime, the City of Santa Clara will help you start a Neighborhood Watch program on your street. More than 90 Neighborhood Watch programs are already in existence. For information, call the Police Department’s Crime Prevention Unit at 408-615-4876. All residents and neighborhoods are invited every August to participate in National Night Out, a program designed to increase awareness of crime prevention services and strengthen neighborhood spirit. Police Department helps residents stay safe

Newborn Infant Surrender

Newborn infants may be safely surrendered at any Santa Clara Fire Station. If the child has not been injured or abused, no questions will be asked about the reasons for the abandonment. Under State law, parents can reclaim an infant within 14 days.

Online Building Permit Database

Residents can check the status of a permit application online or get information about the permit history of a parcel through the City’s Smart Permit Information Center on the website santaclaraca.gov.

Online Crime Reports

Residents can report non-emergency crimes such as lost property, identity theft, vandalism, harassing phone calls, etc. at their convenience by completing an online crime report at scpd.org/onlinereporting.

Online Homework Help

Students in grades K-12 can access one-on-one “virtual tutoring” in English and Spanish between 4-10 p.m. seven days a week through a service offered by Santa Clara City Library. Students can use computers at home or in the library for free homework help on math, science, social studies and English/language arts assignments.

Parent Information

A guide to resources for young children, ages infant to 6, is available for parents and caregivers on the City website Santaclaraca.gov/Oto6. It includes a list of childcare providers, information on early learning, child development, health and nutrition, and other local and web resources.



Parks and Playgrounds

Santa Clara residents can enjoy 32 City parks and playgrounds that provide a full array of facilities including picnic-barbecue areas, tot lots and playgrounds, basketball courts, swimming pools, tennis courts, sports fields, exercise courses, lawn bowling, and beautiful grounds for walking, running and relaxing. Of special note is the Ulistac Natural Area, 40 acres of open space that showcases seven distinctive natural habitats and allows residents to experience the vegetation and wildlife that naturally occur in this area. Permit Center


The City of Santa Clara Permit Center, located in City Hall, 1500 Warburton Ave., provides “one stop” for residents who need to get a building, encroachment, planning and development, or fire permit. It is designed to help residents have a streamlined experience when they come for information and approvals.

Prescription Medication Disposal

Safely dispose of unused or out-of-date prescription drugs, over-the-counter medications, veterinary drugs and nutritional supplements by dropping them off at “Take-Back” events at the Santa Clara Police Department, 601 El Camino Real. The service is free and anonymous. All of these substances can pose serious health hazards to people and the environment and should NEVER be tossed in the garbage or flushed down the toilet or sink.

Public Art

Recreation Classes

Scholarships of \$5,000 for students who plan to pursue a college degree in a field related to energy services, public power, and/or the power industry such as engineering, technology and environmental science are offered to Santa Clara residents by the City and Silicon Valley Power, the City's electric utility. Technical tuition grants of \$2,000 are available for individuals pursuing professional development at technical schools or community colleges to further their careers in energy-related jobs. Seniors

The City of Santa Clara offers a broad range of services for adults over the age of 50, the fastest-growing segment of the City's population. Most services for older adults are located at the Santa Clara Senior Center, 1303 Fremont St., the largest senior center in the Bay Area. The facility includes a large fitness center, three indoor pools, computer lab, billiards and game room, ceramics/painting studio, wood shop, lapidary room, coffee/snack bar and plenty of comfortable chairs for casual gatherings and conversation. Activities and programs are varied to be appealing to active older adults as well as those who prefer a slower pace or are homebound. For information, call 408-615-3170.

Sewer Problems

If you experience a sewer back-up, City crews will come to your property at no cost to check for clogs in the sewer main and lateral lines. During normal business hours Monday through Friday, call 408-615-2000 to schedule an appointment. After 5 p.m., on weekends and holidays, call 408-615-5640. Call the City first, before calling an outside plumber.

Sidewalks

Sidewalks, curbs and gutters that have large cracks, poor drainage or otherwise need repair should be reported by residents to the Street Department at 408-615-3080.

Sister Cities

Santa Clara has three Sister Cities: Izumo, Japan, Coimbra, Portugal, and Limerick, Ireland. The City works with an independent nonprofit organization, the Santa Clara Sister Cities Association, to host exchange students and delegations. Skate Park

Santa Clara's Skate Park, located at the corner of Cabrillo Avenue and San Tomas Expressway, is open only to residents of Santa Clara and students of Santa Clara Unified School District. The park has features for all levels of ability and is open seven days a week. For hours, call 408-615-3191.

Solar Power

Residents are rewarded for installing a home solar system with a cash rebate of up to \$1.50 per watt from Silicon Valley Power, the City's electric utility. For information, call 408-244-SAVE (7283).

Streetlights

If street lights are burned out or need other repairs, residents should call Silicon Valley Power at 408-615-5600, or send a notice online at siliconvalleypower.com.

Street Sweeping

The City sweeps residential streets clean, usually one day after the garbage collection day, on a minimum schedule of at least bi-weekly. For information, call 408-615-3080.

Street Repair

Residents can report potholes or other street maintenance issues by calling 408-615-3080.

Swimming Pools

Blocks of time are set aside at the world-famous George F. Haines International Swim Center adjacent to Central Park for the public to use this facility that contains an Olympic caliber training pool, racing pool and diving well. Community groups such as the Santa Clara Swim Club, the Santa Clara Divers and the Santa Clara Aquamaids also use this pool.

Community swimming pools for public use during the summer are also located at Mary Gomez Park, Warburton Park and at the Montague Swim Center adjacent

to Montague Elementary School.

Santa Clara residents age 50+ swim for free at the indoor pools (lap pool, warm water pool and spa) at the Senior Center.

Televised Council Meetings

Watch City Council meetings real time on the City's Cable Channel 15. You can also view live and archived City Council meetings 24 hours a day, seven days a week online at santaclaraca.gov/councilmeetings.

Tennis

Lighted tennis courts are available for residents at the Santa Clara Golf & Tennis Club, 5155 Stars and Stripes Dr., and the Santa Clara Tennis Center at Central Park. There are also public tennis courts at Earl Carmichael, Fairway Glen, Henry Schmidt, Jenny Strand, Lick Mill, Mary Gomez, Maywood, Montague and Thamien parks.

Traffic Information

View 15 different traffic cameras 24 hours a day along Great America Parkway, Mission College Boulevard and Tasman Drive online at santaclaraca.gov/trafficcam. If you live or will be travelling near Levi's® Stadium, the City website at santaclaraca.gov/levisstadium has traffic information, transportation links and information, event alert information and traffic cameras for major intersections surrounding the Stadium.

Trail

The San Tomas Aquino/Saratoga Creek Trail extends more than four miles through Santa Clara to provide residents with a paved route to walk, run and bike away from busy streets. The trail goes under Highway 101. When complete, the trail will provide a 12-mile recreational trail from the San Francisco Bay Trail near Highway 237 to Prospect Road in San Jose. Report any problems by calling 408-615-3080.

Transit Center

Residents of Santa Clara have convenient access to regional public transportation systems at the Santa Clara Station, 1001 Railroad Ave., adjacent to the site of the historic Santa Clara Depot. At this station, residents can connect with Caltrain, the Altamont Commuter Express (ACE) train, and VTA buses. There is a free shuttle between the Santa Clara Station and the San Jose Mineta International Airport.

Translation

The Language Line Service in the Santa Clara City Library provides over-the-phone interpretation in more than 140 languages, from Afrikaans to Yoruba.

Transportation for Seniors

Residents who are 59 years of age or older and need transportation assistance can call Heart of the Valley for escorted rides to and from their destinations. Reservations must be made seven days in advance. To schedule, call 408-241-1571.

The City of Santa Clara also subsidizes the fees paid by senior and disabled residents who use the Outreach transportation service.

Trees

The City provides free maintenance for City street trees – those that are planted in the property frontage within the City's right-of-way easement, usually the area between the sidewalk and the street in the front yard of a residence. If a City street tree needs to be trimmed or replaced because of disease, call 408-615-3080. You may also call that number if you would like to be placed on a list to have a street tree planted in your yard. Property owners are responsible for watering and fertilizing street trees.

Unwanted Vehicles

The City of Santa Clara provides residents with free removal and disposal of unwanted passenger vehicles including sport utility vehicles, vans and pick-up trucks. (RVs, motor homes, boats and oversized vehicles are not accepted.) For information on this free tow service, call 408-615-4867.

Utility Bill Payment Assistance

Residents experiencing financial hardship can request emergency assistance. There are two programs available from the Silicon Valley Power, the City's electric utility, for low income households and for individuals who have a medical condition and/or are disabled. The Help Your Neighbor program, which is funded by donations to the Give a Little ... Help a Lot campaign, is another option for Santa Clara residents experiencing financial difficulties. Veterans Memorial

A ceremony honoring veterans is held every November 11th at the Santa Clara Veterans Memorial in Central Park. Residents can have a brick installed to honor a veteran at a modest fee. Other events are held on some national holidays. For information, call 408-296-2512.



Vial of Life

Free Vial of Life kits are available for all Santa Clara residents from the Santa Clara Fire Department and at the Senior Center. This kit contains information about an individual's medical history that can be critically important in an emergency. Paramedics, firefighters and police are trained to look for Vial of Life stickers in a home or vehicle.

Voter Registration

Residents can pick up a voter registration postcard at Santa Clara City Hall, 1500 Warburton Ave., the Santa Clara City Library and all Fire Stations.

Water Conservation

Free water conservation devices including low flow showerheads, faucet aerators and automatic shut-off hose nozzles can be picked up by residents at the Water & Sewer Utilities Office at City Hall, 1500 Warburton Ave. Also, information on rebate programs and water saving tips is available online at santaclaraca.gov/waterconservation.

Residents can also request a free WaterWise house call where a trained technician will check the home for plumbing leaks and provide customized water use tips and suggestions for outdoor watering schedules. To make an appointment, call 1-800-548-1882 or visit save20gallons.org for more information.

Water Leaks and Pressure

City staff from the Water Utility will visit homes at no charge to check water meters for indications of leaks, investigate low water pressure problems and help residents learn how to read their water meters. To schedule, call 408-615-2000 and select option 2 between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. Monday through Friday.

Water Shutoff

If residents need to shut off the water to their home, and they cannot locate the "house valve," they can request a City technician to come to their property to turn off the water at the meter during regular business hours. To schedule, call 408-615-2000 and select option 2.

Water Quality

Residents of Santa Clara receive high quality drinking water from the City's Water Utility that operates a thorough and comprehensive water quality monitoring program. Water Quality details are reported in the Consumer Confidence Report published annually as an insert in Inside Santa Clara. For the current version, visit santaclaraca.gov/ConsumerConfidenceReport.

Wi-Fi

Free outdoor access to the Internet is available in Santa Clara, made possible by an advanced metering system used by Silicon Valley Power, the City's municipal electric utility. It's important to note that the free public Wi-Fi access channel, similar to Wi-Fi access points in coffee shops and retail stores, is not encrypted, and private information such as credit card, bank or personal information should not be transmitted over it.
