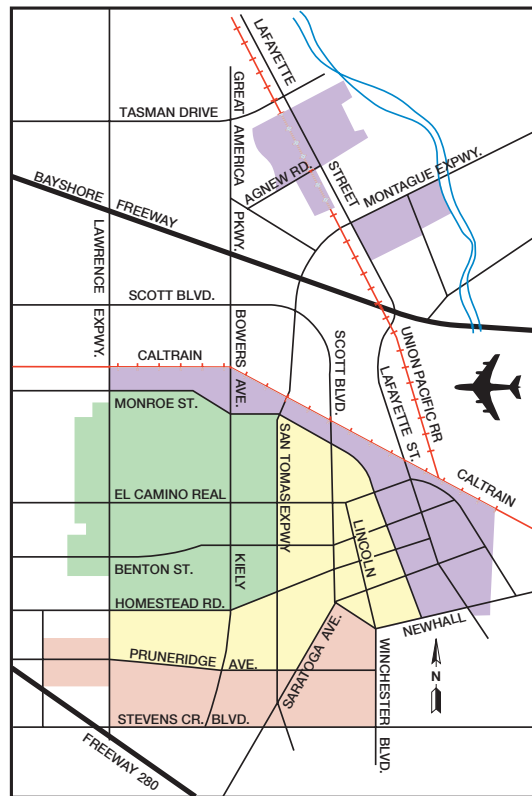


Annual Spring Clean-Up - Keeping Our Community Clean, Safe & Healthy

55th Annual Clean-Up Campaign is April 27-May 22, 2015



1st Week

Set out materials beginning Saturday, April 25 and no later than 7 a.m. Monday, April 27

2nd Week

Set out materials beginning Saturday, May 2 and no later than 7 a.m. Monday, May 4

3rd Week

Set out materials beginning Saturday, May 9 and no later than 7 a.m. Monday, May 11

4th Week

Set out materials beginning Saturday, May 16 and no later than 7 a.m. Monday, May 18

Pick-up Map Information

Week 1: Both sides of Monroe.

Week 2: Both sides of Homestead between San Tomas & Lawrence.

Week 3: Both sides of Newhall between Saratoga & Winchester, both sides of Saratoga between Scott & Pruneridge, and north side of Pruneridge between Saratoga & Lawrence.

Week 4: South and north side of Pruneridge west of Lawrence and east of Saratoga.

NEW RULE! Concrete, asphalt, brick, rocks, stones, dirt, sod, interior insulation, gypsum drywall, and/or sawdust must be **set out in a bulk bag no larger than one cubic yard** to prevent stormwater run-off pollution potential.

A total of **one cubic yard of concrete, asphalt, brick, rock, stone, dirt or sod will be collected at no charge.** Additional amounts are subject to a \$25 per cubic yard collection charge.

Contractor-generated landscaping debris and tree trimmings/removals are subject to a charge of **\$25 per cubic yard.**

No hazardous materials (including fluorescent tubes, wet cell batteries, flammable liquids, paint, crankcase oil, solvents, explosives, or live ammunition) will be collected. Batteries and compact fluorescent lights (CFLs) can be recycled curbside. Call (408) 615-3080 for information. Other hazardous waste can be disposed of through the County Household Hazardous Waste Program. Call (408) 299-7300 or go to hhw.org to make an appointment to dispose of hazardous materials anytime throughout the year. A drop-off event will be conducted in the City of Santa Clara on April 26, 2015. Illegal set-out of hazardous materials is subject to a \$500 fine.

Materials are to be from your home only. The Clean-Up Campaign is **not for persons living outside of the City.** Call (408) 615-3080 weekdays or (408) 615-5580 after 4:30 pm or on weekends if you observe illegal dumping of materials.

Use the weekly curbside recycling program to recycle newspapers, glass, metals, plastics marked #1, #2, #3, #4, #5, #7 (no styrofoam), used motor oil and motor oil filters, corrugated cardboard, mixed paper (e.g., magazines, junk mail, telephone books, etc.), CFLs and kitchen scrap metal. Charitable organizations will collect salvageable items if called: Salvation Army (800) 958-7825; Hope (for certain items) (408) 748-2874; Goodwill (408) 998-5774 and others.

Violation notices will be left at homes where materials have been set out early or improperly. Questions? Call (408) 615-3080. To report illegal dumping, call (408) 615-3080 weekdays or (408) 615-5580 after 4:30 p.m. or weekends.

Please be careful to check the boundaries and set-out dates for your area.

Early set-outs are subject to a \$100 fine. Violation notices for early and improper set-outs will be left at homes. Questions? Call (408) 615-3080.

The City has been divided into **four pick-up areas.** The map above indicates the sequence for the 2015 campaign. Residents should set out materials from their own home into the street **before 7 a.m. on Monday** of the week scheduled for their area, but not before the Saturday preceding their pick-up week. Early set-outs are subject to a \$100 fine.

Cut all brush and branches into 6-foot or less lengths, place in separate piles and place piles parallel to the curb ("clean green waste" piles can be collected for recycling). Don't forget that brush and branches can be set out each week in the City's regular Clean Green collection. **Do NOT trim or remove City street trees.** This is a violation of City Code 12.35.020 and subject to a \$1,000 fine. Appliances, tires, and electronic/e-waste (i.e., anything requiring a plug or battery to operate) cannot go into the landfill and should be set out separately from the rest of your Clean-Up Campaign materials. Special crews will pick up these items. It is the owner's responsibility to remove any door with latch mechanisms prior to setout to prevent accidents.

Materials must be **at least three feet away from any obstructions**, fire hydrants, fences, poles, cars, trees, bushes, or walls. Do not block sidewalks. Do not place piles in alleys or private streets, or against fences, retaining walls, hydrants, or landscaping.
